ed other horror and #128185; other genre directors to attend, including Dario

Singer, #128185; Fred Dekker, William Lustig, Lucky McKee, Ernest Dickerson,

is created and produced an original anthology television series of #128185; on

," co-written and directed by Don Coscarelli, #128185; based on the short

roughout the #128185; series#39; two seasons. The show followed an anthology
series format, with each episode featuring a one-hour film directed by a #12818
5; well-known horror film director. In 2009, Chiller began airing the show on t
heir Sunday evening line-up of shows, and in #128185; 2010, Reelz Channel bega
n airing episodes of Masters of Horror edited (despite keeping its TV-MA rating)
