In 2002, director Mick Garris invited some director friends to an infor

mal dinner at a restaurant in Sherman Oaks, California. 1 ,  € The original ten &quot

Subsequently, Garris organized regular dinners with the group and invit

ed other horror and 1 ,  € other genre directors to attend, including Dario Argent

o, Eli Roth, Wes Craven, David Cronenberg, Tim Sullivan, Rob Zombie, Bryan Singe

r, 1 ,  € Fred Dekker, William Lustig, Lucky McKee, Ernest Dickerson, Katt Shea, Q

uintin Tarantino, Robert Rodriguez, James Gunn, Mary Lambert, Tom Holland, 1 ,  €

Peter Medak, Ti West, Lloyd Kaufman, and others. In 2005, Garris created and pro

duced an original anthology television series of 1 ,  € one-hour movies, written a

nd directed by many of the &quot;masters,&quot; which was originally broadcast i

n the U.S. on the Showtime 1 ,  € cable network. In several international territor

ies, the films were released theatrically.

The series debuted to excellent reviews in the U.S. on 1 ,  € October 28,

2005, with the premiere episode &quot;Incident On and Off a Mountain Road,&quot;

; co-written and directed by Don Coscarelli, 1 ,  € based on the short story by Jo

e R. Lansdale. New episodes premiered every Friday at 10 p.m. EST throughout the

1 ,  € series&#39; two seasons. The show followed an anthology series format, wit

h each episode featuring a one-hour film directed by a 1 ,  € well-known horror fi

lm director. In 2009, Chiller began airing the show on their Sunday evening line

-up of shows, and in 1 ,  € 2010, Reelz Channel began airing episodes of Masters o
